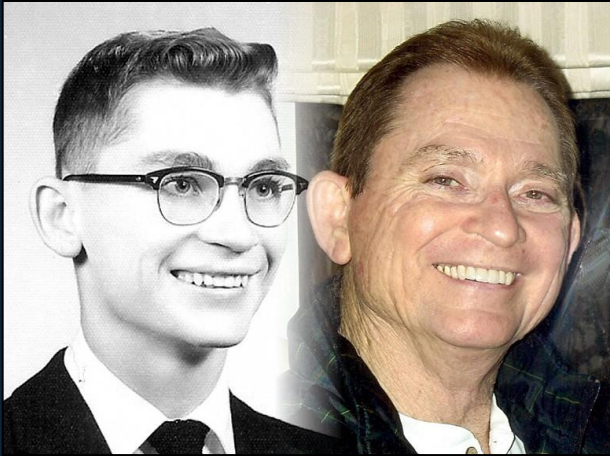


## In Memoriam
